Games

20 Questions a.k.a. Animal/Vegetable/Mineral

First player thinks of any object/item and decides whether it belongs to the category of animal, vegetable, or mineral: Animal - Any living (or dead) animals, including humans (includes famous or well known people) Vegetable - All plants. Mineral - Anything made from non-living material. Once a player has decided on the item and category it belongs to, they tell other player(s) which of the three categories it is in. The other player(s) then have to find out what the item is by asking up to 20 yes or no questions. The first player can ONLY answer “yes” or “no.” If a player has not guessed the answer by the 20th question, the first player wins and gets another chance. Otherwise, the player who guessed wins and thinks of a new item.

Big Booty

Make a circle. One person is designated as “Big Booty.” The person to Big Booty’s left is designated #1 (next is #2, then #3, and so on). These numbers are temporary as the goal of the game is to move up to “Big Booty” level. The group will sing the following tune while clapping in rhythm, “Aww, yeah, big booty, big booty, big booty...” Big Booty begins by yelling out “Big Booty” followed by somebody’s number in the circle. For example, “Big Booty, #7.” Then #7 must respond by yelling his/her number followed by somebody else’s number or Big Booty. If your response is out of rhythm, then that person must move to the end of the line (becomes the highest number in the circle) and everyone else moves to a lower number. The game continues for as long as the group can handle it.

Birdie on a Perch

Pair off, and have each pair decide who is the apple and who is the orange. Apples get in a circle, and oranges make a circle inside that one. Everyone faces their partners. As they sing a song, the circles run around in opposite directions. When someone yells “BIRDIE ON A PERCH!” the oranges have to find their partner and jump in the air, getting caught by their partner. The last pair to get perched is out. Go until you find your Best Birdie and Best Perch.

Ninja

All the players get in a circle and say “Unicamp” as they bow to each other. When the players return to standing, each strikes a ninja pose (no fists, no hands behind the back). The goal is to hit ANY player’s hand (fingertip to wrist) with your hand. One player moves at a time (turns go in a circle), and each player gets one ninja move (ex. A leap or ninja chop) to try to hit someone else. If you are being attacked, you get one movement to escape. Once each movement is made, the player has to freeze in that exact position (the circle doesn’t get smaller just because someone is out) until they are attacked or until their next turn. When a player is hit, he or she is out, and leaves the game. The last two players remaining turn their backs to each other, and bow facing away from each other and say “UniCamp.” When they stand back up, they turn and face in new ninja stances just like before. The game goes the same way until a winner is found!

Ride that Pony

Same as Little Sally Walker, except the song goes “Here we go, ride that pony, ride around that big fat pony, here we go, ride that pony, this is how we do it.” Then, the people dancing in the middle will partner up with someone in the circle for, “front to front to front, my baby; side to side to side, my baby; back to back to back, my baby; this is how we do it.” Then, that dancing pair trades and the game continues forever and ever<3 (UniCamp record = 33 minutes)

Salute the Captain

This game is similar to Simon Says. Then the leader says “Salute the Captain,” the group stands at attention, saluting the captain. However, after the leader says “Salute the Captain, the phrase “At ease” has to be said before the players can move to the command. Here are the commands and motions: Swab the Deck (2 people - Find a partner and hold hands, act like you’re mopping the floor.) Man Overboard (3 people - Two people make a boat by holding hands and the third person stands inside the boat and they all rock.) Row the Boat (4 people - Stand in a line, rowing.) Grub Time (5 people - Stand in a small circle and eat). If you’re left out of a group or your group doesn’t have enough people, you’re out!

Moaded, Corroded, Your Booty Exploded

The group sits in a big circle. A circle that’s big. One person is the guesser and leaves the circle. Everyone else decides on a “leader.” Whatever this person does, everyone else will follow. Start some simple movement (clapping hands, snapping, etc.) and call the guesser back. This person will have three tries to guess who the leader is. If the person guesses incorrectly, the people outside the circle will say “Moaded!” for the first time, “Corroded!” the second time, and “Your booty exploded!” for the third time. Once their booty has exploded, do not panic. Instead, have the guesser write their name in the air with their just-exploded rear end. If the guesser guessed right, they become the leader and play again.

Name Thing

All that is required is paper and pen for each player. Across the top of the paper, write the alphabet from a-z. Then under the alphabet create 6 columns with the headings: Name, Thing, Food, Colour, Place, Animal.

You can vary the order, but all players should list them in the same order as each other. When it is their turn chooses a letter of the alphabet. On the command “go,” players then write a name, thing, food, color, place, and animal beginning with the letter that was chosen as fast as they can. The player who finishes first shouts “stop” or “done” and the other players stop writing. Players then compare their lists by reading their answers. 5 points are given for every completed word (abbreviated or half words don’t count). If any players have the same word for the same category, that word for that category does not count for any player, but plural and singular versions of a word are not counted as the same. At the end of the round, the letter chosen is crossed off the list so it isn’t reused and the next player chooses a letter. Some letters are tricky/hard to use, so players can say that they are “out” (unable to think of any more words)

Screaming Feet

This is a good energy-raising game! Stand in a small circle. A circle that's small. Everyone looks down at their feet in the circle. On the count of 3, everyone raises their head and stares at someone to make eye contact. If two people make eye contact, the last person to scream is out. Continue until there are only a few people left.

Heads Up, Seven Up

4 players are selected and stand to one side, all other players sit quietly on the floor or on chairs. On the command "Heads Up, Seven Up," those sitting have to put their heads down, close their eyes, and put their fists by the side of their heads with their thumbs sticking out. When everybody has complied the 3 or 4 players previously chosen walk as quietly as possible around the group and choose one person each by touching/gently gripping the person's thumbs. When a player is touched on their thumb, they fold them into their fists, indicating that they have already been selected. When each walking person has chosen a thumbs up player, they go back to the side. The leader calls "heads up," and all players sitting can look up. Those players who were touched put their hands up to indicate they were chosen and try to guess which of those standing touched them. If they are right, they swap places

Honey Do You Love Me?

This game is played by having a group of people sit in a circle and one person in the middle. The person in the middle has to go up to the people in the circle and ask them "Honey do you love me?" If the person being asked laughs, then they become the person in the middle. If not, the person who asked keeps going around asking everyone until they manage to get someone to laugh. (It's more fun if you say it in a funny voice or sit on the person's lap).

The Fun Size Game

Separate into small groups of two or more, and each group will come up with a three syllable phrase with accompanying movement. Then, get into a big circle. Go around again in order with everyone doing all the same motions all together on the beat. Once it gets back to the start, the fun (size!) begins. Each team has to coordinate which group to call on next and be in unison while staying on beat. No patterns! That's no fun. Stick to the beat, or your team is eliminated. Yes. It's that big a deal. (Example: Fun Size game, Fun Size game, Fun Size game to the Rocks My Socks! Rocks my socks, Rocks my socks, Rocks my socks to the All Day Long... you get the picture.)

G'Day Bruce

Everyone gets in a circle, and starts off being named "Bruce." The first person begins the game, turning to the next player and saying "G'day Bruce." The second player responds "G'day Bruce." The first player then introduces the third player with "Say g'day to Bruce, Bruce!" The second player now turns to the third player and the dialogue repeats. Here's where it gets tricky. The WHOLE game needs to be played with an Australian accent, and if at any point a player stutters, pauses, laughs, or messes up in ANY way, the entire group points their fingers in the air, and sings "Sheila, Sheila, Sheila! Sheila, Sheila, Sheila!" while dancing. That player is now named "Sheila," and must be referred to by that name by all the other player during the dialogue. If someone says the wrong name, now THEY are a Sheila. As you can tell, the game gets pretty confusing, and people start messing up more. Each time they mess up, they get a new name. The names go Bruce, Sheila, Dingo, Wombat... and then make up your own!

Giants, Wizards, and Elves

It's like a gigantic game of ro-sham-bo come to life. Split up into two teams. Have a battle line in the middle and two safe zones equidistant from the line. Each team will have some time to huddle and come up with a sign and a backup. The signs can be any combination of Giants, Wizards, or Elves. Giants stop the Wizards, who zaps the Elves, who topple the giants. After they have picked their signs, the teams approach the battle line and on the count of three make their motion with the appropriate sound effect. Whoever wins chases the other team, trying to tag as many as they can before the others pass into their safe zone. Whoever was tagged goes to the other team. If the two sides both use the same sign, count to three again and have them use their second sign. Remember: make those motions and sounds!

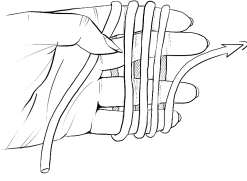
Creepy Crawly

Divide players into teams. Each team takes a 'corner' standing in a single file facing the center of the room where the object is placed. At command each team gets on all fours while the back member going legs astride over their team members to the front and where they then get down on all fours. Once in place the next rear player repeats the process until the team is close enough to capture the object. To ensure no cheating the front player must hold the ankles of the one newly crouching down in front of them. Players may stretch out to the full to reach the object.

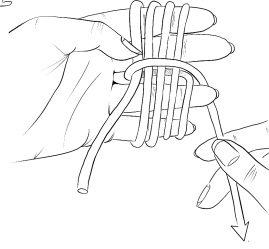

Riddles

Around the World

A word game. You must figure out where you are able to go on a vacation. The trick is, you have to spell out the phrase “around the world” with the first letters of the locations you visit. For example: you can start off going to **A**lbania and then go to **R**ome. But after Rome, you can’t go to California (which you can never go to in this game), instead you can go to **O**hio.

Bang Bang Game

One person in the group says and motions, “Bang, bang, bang,” however many times and in any pattern they want and then asks the group: “who died?” The trick is, the first person who speaks after the leader says “who died” is the one who dies.

Black Magic

One person leaves the group to be the “guesser.” The guesser needs to be in on the game. You choose an object in the group that will be “it,” and make sure the whole group knows what the object is. Then the guesser comes back, and the leader asks them questions: “Is it the book? Is it the chair” etc etc, to which the guesser will correctly reply “no.” However, then the leader will ask them “Is it the [insert black object here]?” The answer is no, but the black object signals that the next object asked about will be the correct one. (Hence, black magic).

Bobby’s World

Similar to Around the World. You’re going to Bobby’s world. And you want to bring stuff with you. So the leader gives the group some examples of what you’re allowed to bring to Bobby’s World, and things you’re not allowed to bring. The key: you can only bring things with double-letters in the word (like the word Bobby).

Four is the Magic Number

Here is an example: 10 is 3, 3 is 5, 5 is 4, 4 is the magic number. The way this works is that you spell out the numbers, and the number “is” the number of letters in the spelling. TEN is 3 (letters), THREE is 5 (letters), FIVE is 4 (letters), and FOUR is 4... the magic number!

CONTACT

This game pits everyone in a group against one person. The game starts with Player 1 thinking of a word and telling everyone what letter the word he or she is thinking of begins with (ex. If P1 is thinking of “color,” they would say the word starts with “C”). It is everyone else’s goal to make a “contact.” Any player (P2) will ask a question to P1 (ex. Is it an animal?) while having an answer to his or her own question in mind. The answer they are thinking of has to begin with the letter P1 gave to begin with (ex. P2’s answer to her own question is “cat”). The other players in the game (P3) make a contact if they believe they are thinking of the same thing as P2. If they think they have a contact, they say, “Contact! 1, 2, 3...” and on “3” both P2 and P3 yell out the word they had in mind. If they make a match (both say “cat”) then P1 has lost the round. If they say different things (cat and cow) then they need to ask another question and try for another contact. After P2 asks the question though, P1 will try to beat the others by answering, “No, it is not a ___” (their answer has to start with the original letter as well) before the others can make a contact. If P1 succeeds by guessing P2’s word, the others need to try a new question to make a contact. If the others make a contact before P1 can answer, P1 has to give the next letter of his word, and all answers have to begin with the new letter.

Note: *When P1 answers, “No, it is not a ___,” his answer does not have to match what P2 was thinking, it just has to answer the question reasonably. If the response to P2’s question is “Yes,” then P1 just answers yes, and the others ask new questions. The game ends when everyone figures out P1’s word.*

Good Line/Bad Line

The leader gives examples of good lines and bad lines. Everyone else must figure out what makes a good line and what makes a line bad. The trick is that if the speaker says “OK” before asking the question, it’s a good line. Example: “Ok, from the lodge to the kitchen.” (that is a good line). “A line from the lodge to the kitchen.” (that is a bad line).

Note: *A lot of games are played with this “OK” rule. “Johnny Johnny Johnny Johnny Oops Johnny” is played this way. So is “The Blank Game” where the blank is any object you hold while doing some motion and saying “I can play the blank game the blank game can you?” This game can also be played with the rule being you have to use your left hand to hold the object*

If This is a Cup

Pick two objects. Maybe they have something in common. Ask the group, “Listen, if [object] is a cup and [object] is a cup, are they cups? Yes, they are. The trick: as long as you say “listen” in some way before asking the question, they’re cups. After a while if they don’t get it, you’ll hear a lot of “I AM listening!!” Congratulations, if you play this game you’re a butthead

I Like Coffee But I Don’t Like Tea

Basically, any word with a “T” in it is something you do not like. If it has a “C” in it, you like it, but if has both a “T” and a “C,” you don’t like it.

Zero is the Game

This game works best when you are sitting down. Hold up a fist and say, "This is the game." Then, hold up random numbers of fingers and say "This is ____." You can have patterns or not, but it might be something like you hold up one finger and say "This is 5," hold up two fingers and say, "This is 10," then you hold up three fingers and ask, "What is this?" Trick is, the number is whatever you are holding up slyly on your other hand. Everyone's just so concentrated on your first hand! Tricky!

Numbers Game

Hold up one finger. "If this is one..." Hold up two fingers. "If this is two..." Hold up three things. "And if this is three..." Hold up five fingers. "What's this?" No, it's not five. It's one. The trick is no matter what strange combination you do with your fingers, if you use both hands, if you turn your hands around, upside down, whatever; it's always the first number.

Sculpture Game

Grab a few anythings and sit in a group. Tell the group that you're going to make a sculpture of someone in the group. (Wording here is important). Then proceed to put the sticks/etc. into some type of arbitrary order, shape or just complete randomness. Make it look very deliberate when you're organizing them. Then, when you're done, sit down or stand up mimicking a person in your group. Your body becomes a sculpture of someone in the group, just like you said it would! Then ask, "Who am I?"

Snaps

Snaps is the name of the game. Someone leaves the group (is in on the trick), and the leader decides with the rest of the group an arbitrary word or camper name. Then the person comes back, and the leader tells them: "Snaps is the name of the game." After the leader says that, everything else coming out of his/her mouth is a clue to what the word/name is. For each consonant, say a phrase that starts with that letter. For each vowel, a *snap* (1 snap for A, 2 snaps for E, etc.) For example: "Snaps is the name of the game. The name of the game is snaps. Really pay attention to what I'm saying. *snap* *snap* <pause> *snap* *snap* (spells TREE)

Umbrella Game

There are many variations of this game and it is similar to Good Line/Bad Line. Tell the group you're all going to a desert island, and you can bring things with you. Everyone is allowed to bring an Umbrella. What else can you bring? The answer is that you have to say the word "Um" before each word. You can bring, um, a cup. But you can't bring a cup. That's why everyone can always bring an umbrella.

Camp Jams

As a unit, complete as many of these challenges as possible. Make sure you are always with a counselor. Camp jams may NOT be done during programming (ex. LSHIP run programs, Night Activities, etc.) or duties. When you complete a camp jam for someone, have them sign it off. At the end of the competition, the unit with the most points will get a special treat. Only one book can be submitted.
